SECRETARY TABLIGH:

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A TABLIGH SECRETARY

When you are doing outreach (Tabligh) work, initially speak to your contacts more generally and show them your **good character** so that they become your friends. The Holy Quran has given the metaphor that you should **attach birds to yourselves** and make them fond of you and train them in such a way that they become fond of you and run towards you. So similarly, with such people you should **create a sincere mutual bond** and when that is achieved, they will listen to you. Then when they find out that you are an Ahmadi Muslim then they will realise [the truth] themselves. Some will leave you but others will continue to remain in contact with you and will be **positively affected** by you. You **cannot forcefully deliver the message to anyone** and neither can you force anyone to become an Ahmadi Muslim.

Therefore, whoever is to come to us should do so with **sincerity and loyalty** and for this we have to continuously make an effort.

So, first establish a **personal bond** with your Tabligh contacts. Then gradually, they will come to realise that you act upon your religious teachings and they will realise you are a true Muslim – that you observe the prayers, recite the Holy Quran, believe in the Seal of the Prophets of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) and you also believe in the Imam of the age. **Successful preaching requires consistent effort.”**

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A TABLIGH SECRETARY

- Keep a record of the local Daiyaat in your Majlis

Active Daiyaat are those members who are consistently engaged in tabligh efforts with contacts and are engaged in Da'wat ilAllah (to call towards Allah).

- The primary role of Tabligh is to spread the true message of Islam and increase new members into the fold of Islam.

As a Tabligh Secretary, your tasks include guiding and encouraging your members to increase the number of active Daiyaat and building new contacts. Another aspect of this role is to encourage members to increase their knowledge so that they can increase their confidence in tabligh efforts.

- Organize a plan for your monthly activities and engage all of the members of your majlis, especially the Daiyaat.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A TABLIGH SECRETARY - Practical Guidance

- Create a local team of 4-5 members to assist you with Tabligh efforts (all should be active in Tabligh)
- Meet with your tabligh team monthly to plan activities. Have a plan laid out for the year
- Keep an up to date account of the local daiyaat and encourage more members to be active
- Tabligh is everyone's responsibility. The minimum number of daiyaat should be the total number of your local amila members
- keep in touch with contacts who have attended local events and follow up with them throughout the year

Bai'at Goal

With the start of the new Lajna year on October 1, 2025, I would like to take this opportunity to remind all local majalis across Canada that our foremost objective remains tabligh — conveying the message of Islam Ahmadiyyat with renewed zeal and dedication. During his Friday Sermon on September 8, 2017 Beloved Huzoor e Anwar (May Allah be his helper) stated:

“We have been commanded to convey the message and we cannot hold back from this, nor will we do so. We will complete what we must do. Only God Almighty knows who will be guided and who will not. Let us make tabligh the heartbeat of our efforts this year, ensuring that every member feels motivated and engaged in this blessed work.

May Allah the Almighty grant us sincerity, unity, and success in achieving this noble goal.



MONTHLY TABLIGH PLAN FOR 2025-2026

November 2025

Establish a connection with a NEW local women's charity or organization. Reach out to the organization, schedule a time to visit them with a few of your local Amila members, introduce the Jamaat and the work of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Women's Association. Please check with National to confirm the organization you have chosen is appropriate. This will be an ongoing relationship - you can invite them to future events and hold food and clothing drives for them.

December 2025

1:1 Tabligh - Hold an end of the year tea gathering with your daiyaat and their contacts

1. May be held in a local member's home or your namaaz centre / mosque if able to
2. Local members can arrange a pot luck for the guests on a small scale
3. Suggested topic for discussion: How do different faiths celebrate the start of the new year (identify one person to speak to Islam's perspective).
4. Arrange a tabligh stall where you display the Holy Quran and leaflets / books of the Jamaat - partner with your local Ishaat Secretary

Share Season's greeting card sent by National Tabligh Department Lajna Ima'illah Canada with local members to send to their contacts

REACH OUT TO A NEW LOCAL WOMEN CENTERED ORGANIZATION SUCH AS A CHARITY AND INTRODUCE LAJNA TO THEM. YOU CAN WORK WITH LOCAL MEMBERS TO HAVE A FOOD DRIVE TO START A RELATIONSHIP.

January 2026

Hold a gathering with your local daiyaat. This can be done in a member's home or in your local mosque. Use this opportunity to motivate your daiyaat, share ideas and think about ideas for the remaining months as to how they can increase their 1:1 tabligh efforts.

Share with the local daiyaat tips for tabligh. the National team will share some tips with you to help with this session.

February 2026

1:1 Tabligh - In recognition of World Hijab Day, hold a get together with your diyaat and their contacts

1. May be held in a local member's home or your namaaz centre / mosque if able to
2. Local members can arrange a pot luck for the guests on a small scale
3. Suggested topic for discussion: What is the hijab and why do I wear it?
4. Arrange a tabligh stall where you display literature about the hijab and women in Islam. You can also have a mirror set up with a try on a hijab section aesthetically decorated.
5. Refrain from taking pictures with Lajna members in them

1. May be held in a local member's home or your namaaz centre / mosque if able to
2. Local members can arrange a pot luck for the guests and work together to decorate the space for the get together
3. Suggested topic for discussion: What is Ramadhan / Eid and why do we celebrate it?
4. Arrange a tabligh stall where you display literature about Eid and the focus of charity and assisting those in need. You can arrange a local food drive and encourage your guests to bring an item
5. Refrain from taking pictures with Lajna members in them

May 2026

Starting encouraging members to invite their contacts to Jalsa Salana Canada 2025

- encourage your daiyaat to meet their contacts 1:1 with the purpose of inviting them to Jalsa Salana
- the tabligh secretary should call each and every member to encourage them to do so.

June 2026

This month focus on silent Tabligh. Look for opportunities to help neighbours, contribute to food banks, visit Residential homes, donate to charity, engage in environmental initiatives etc. Convey the teachings of Islam through your acts of kindness.

Continue encouraging members to invite their contacts to Jalsa Salana Canada (July 2025)

Tabligh secretaries must ensure all their local daiyaat attend the workshop and report the number on their monthly report

Holy Qur'an Exhibition and Tabligh Stall

- **Tabligh Secretaries will arrange exhibition displaying the Holy Qur'an, literature and leaflets published by the Jamaat**
- **These can be arranged in libraries if permitted at various times throughout the year (ie Islamic Heritage month) or during gatherings arranged with contacts at the local level. They may work with other local secretaries in their regions to hold this event**
- **A Tabligh stall is a stall where various Tabligh leaflets as well as books are displayed to spread the message of Islam**
- **The purpose of a Tabligh Stall is to interact with contacts in a positive manner whilst informing them about the true teachings of Islam**
- **Get all your majlis involved –allocate tasks such as making posters, banners, sourcing relevant literature etc.**
- **The Holy Qur'an Exhibition can be a display of the Qur'an in various languages and posters and banners about the Holy Qur'an**
- **Ensure the stall is appealing however it does not have to on a large scale. Use posters, display boards, leaflets and books**
- **Have jamaat contact information at hand for any questions that you are unable to answer**
- **do not engage in ongoing tabligh with male contacts. Take down the contact information from the visitor and arrange for a murabbi to follow up**
- **do not take any picture of stall or exhibitions with Lajna members in them.**

Guidelines for 1:1 Tabligh

Ways of Engaging in One-on-one Tabligh

- From time to time, invite your friends, colleagues and contacts to dinner.
- Invite them to your wedding reception.
- Invite them to "Ameen" and "Aqeeqa" ceremonies of your children.
- Upon the engagement of someone's child, go and congratulate them at their home.
- If you are invited to a wedding reception, do attend, and do offer them a gift, according to your means.
- Upon the birth of a child, go and congratulate them at their home, and do offer them a gift, according to your means — give them a gift.
- Upon someone's child passing an exam, visit them to congratulate them.
- Upon someone's child starting a new business or a job, congratulate them at their home.
- Upon someone returning from Hajj or Umrah, visit them to congratulate them.
- Upon someone building a new home, buying a new car, gaining employment or starting a business, go and congratulate them at their home.
- Provide a ride to the sick to the hospital or to the doctor.
- Inquire after those who are ill or sick at their homes or at the hospital.
- If any ill person is in need of blood, arrange to donate blood.
- Upon someone's passing away, go to offer your condolences to the family
- Listen carefully to people's worries and try to help them as much as possible.
- Upon hearing the worries of someone, suggest they write a letter to Huzoor Anwar (aa) for prayers, or write such a letter for them yourself, on their request.

Guidelines for Coffee Chats

What is the purpose of a Coffee Chats?

Coffee Chats are a good opportunity to engage with your Tabligh contacts in an interactive yet informal setting.

When can you have a coffee chat?

As part of International Women's Day, International Day of Peace, World Hijab day, International Women's day or they can be held at any time to bring your tabligh contacts together. There should be a discussion item that everyone can contribute to. These can be held a local member's home, at your local centre or a public coffee place (keep safety in mind).

What is the format of a Coffee Chat?

Although coffee mornings are informal events, it is advised that you start with Dua and a short welcome from the host. Formal speeches are not necessary, although depending on the theme of your event, you may wish to ask guests to say a few words, The purpose is to let your guests interact freely.

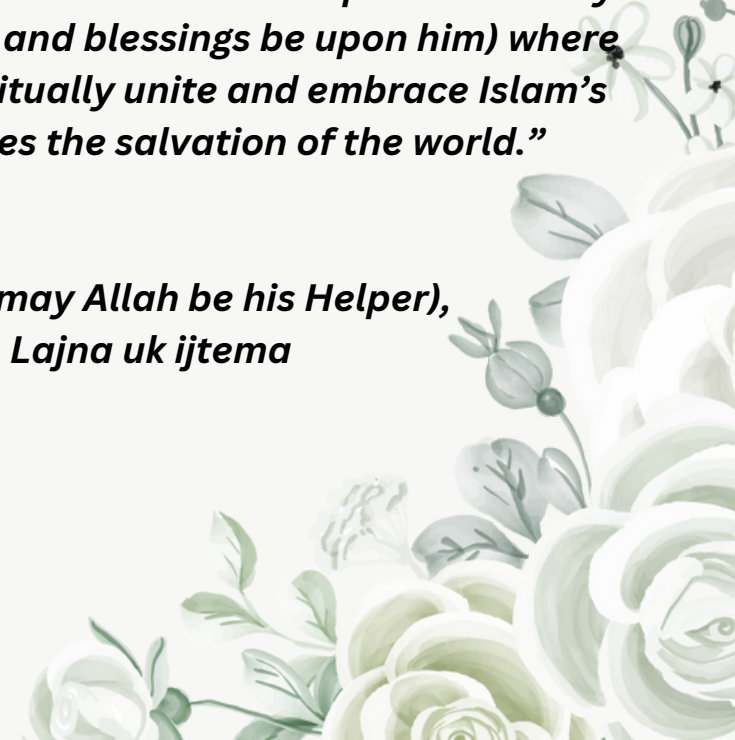
Lajna Ima'illah - A new Century

Focus on prayers and Zikre Ilahi (i.e. Remembrance of Allah)



Refrain from showing off, such as by displaying the bride's gifts and dowry (burri & jahez)



Create a budget and stick to it! Avoid going into debt when paying for the wedding



Avoid unnecessary spending such as extravagant decorations, lavish clothing, expensive halls, fireworks, rose petals, lavish buffet, giving clothes to the bride's in-laws



Make a financial contribution to Maryam Shaadi Fund



Include on the wedding card: guest arrival, program start time, and Family Photo session time



Do not write "No boxed gifts" on the wedding invitation or have a wedding registry



Remember to invite Lajna who may not have any family or who are not well off



The bride should observe proper pardah once she leaves her home or salon to come to the hall



Men should not walk the bride into the ladies hall, including the groom, father, brothers, etc



Female family members can sing the couplets from the Nazam "Mahmood ki Ameen" as the bride enters the ladies hall



No music should be played during the wedding



DJ should not be hired



Have a simple agenda that includes tilawat, nazam and dua; there's no need to have speeches



Avoid unislamic customs & traditions, such as:

- bridal showers, bachelorette parties
- hiding the groom's shoes
- putting a garland around his neck
- presenting milk to him
- cake cutting
- bridesmaids & flower girls



During the Walima, there is only dua and nothing else in the program



Do hire a female photographer/videographer for the ladies side



Do not have male photo/videographers/waiters on the ladies side



Female photographer on the ladies side should be mindful of asking guests first before taking their picture



Guests should avoid taking pictures/making videos with cell phones as it compromises the Pardah of other guests

IMPORTANCE OF WASIYYAT FOR OFFICE BEARERS

"Draw the attention of your own Amila members and remind them that everyone should join the institution of Wasiyyat. But you should not force them to do this. If someone says that he cannot join the Wasiyyat because he is unable to fulfill the conditions of the wasiyyat, then you can ask them whether they are fulfilling the ten conditions of Bai'at, and that if they are not doing so then they cannot even remain an Ahmadi. The aim is to try to live up to these conditions, and one should continue to strive towards this".

وَلَا يُبْدِينَ زِينَتَهُنَّ إِلَّا مَا ظَهَرَ مِنْهَا وَلْيَضْرِبْنَ بِخُمُرِهِنَّ
عَلَى جُيُوبِهِنَّ

And say to the believing women that they restrain their eyes and guard their private parts, and that they disclose not their natural and artificial beauty except that which is apparent thereof, and that they draw their head-coverings over their bosoms (24:32)

"Similarly, Ahmadi women and girls should always remember that, in the name of fashion or following the latest trends, they should not sacrifice their modesty. Some Lajna members say they have covered part of their heads and consider that enough. Similarly, some ladies wear overcoats in the name of observing pardah (the veil) but with sleeves rolled all the way up their arms. Yet, Allah the Almighty has already stated that the hijab requires a woman to fully cover her hair in public and to wear loose fitting garments and ensure that her collar and chest area is not exposed. So, Ahmadi women should pay careful attention to protecting their modesty and chastity. Failing to do so is to violate the commands of Allah and those limits established by Islam for the sake of protecting the dignity and virtue of Muslim women."

Our hair should be completely covered, both at the front and back

Our chin should be covered at a minimum and a niqab worn if we are wearing embellished make-up

Sides of the cheeks should be covered so no hair shows

A Jilbab can be a burqah, coat, shador, etc as long as it is an outer garment

If the outer garment has buttons or a zipper, they need to close all the way down

The outer garment should be loose fitting, simple, not unnecessarily embroidered

The outer garment must fall below the knees
